Not even a crummy aviation economy (nor Hurricane Ike last year) can stop Strom Aviation's 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Texas Shotgun Golf Tournament (<u>www.TexasShotgun.com</u>) invitation from circumnavigating firewalls and SPAM filters around the country to arrive today, right now, at this very moment in your e-mail inbox. Having now traveled so dangerously far this e-mail proudly and enthusiastically announces that this year's Texas Shotgun event will snap hook into Dallas/Fort Worth on September 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> and will again aim to raise money and awareness for the Children's Medical Center (<u>www.childrens.com</u>) and we hope you will make plans to participate in this aviation tradition.

Briefly, (and I may just be saying that) in our 10 previous years of hosting this aviation event it has never failed to entertain and captivate the aviation decision makers from across the country while tapping into our industry's generosity as a group and proving beyond a shadow of a doubt that we are generally horrific golfers. As usual we will be having an optional pre-tournament round of golf at Bear Creek on Friday, September 11<sup>th</sup> with a shotgun start at 1:30 p.m. at a cost of \$50 per person. Immediately following the practice round there will more quality time spent in the local pub getting caught up with your new found friends. This will also be a good time to try to bribe us (via donations to the charity) to ensure that you do not get paired up with that golf purist you saw from that aviation company that you can't remember, who was playing with wood shafted clubs and some old turkey feathered or elephant dung wrapped hair ball.

The Main event will occur on Saturday, September 12<sup>th</sup> with a shotgun start at 1:30 p.m. Pairings will be established by your always fair and unbiased Texas Shotgun professionals; however if you would like to try to rig our tournament (good luck!) you may pay \$500 to make your own foursome which would help our charity cause. ## Footnote:
