Strom Aviation is proud to officially tee off the 17th Annual Aviation Texas Shotgun Golf Tournament benefitting Children's Health (formerly Children's Medical Center) on Saturday, September 12th at The Golf Club at Fossil Creek in Fort Worth, Texas and all you have to do is RSVP NOW with your intent to join us. Of course we hope you will also consider sponsoring, buying a foursome, or perhaps just raising money for the charity, but for now we invite you to sit back and enjoy what is part of this aviation community tradition: the official 2015 Texas Shotgun Golf Invitation.

I have got to be honest with you, your Texas Shotgun Golf Chairs, who thought they had seen it all in golf event planning, were seriously stressed this year prior to sending out this invitation (yes this is our golf invitation!). We are talking about the accelerated level of heart-beating stress caused by an overaggressive John Daly-like backswing and the inevitable sliced tee shot which results where Nostradamus isn't needed to see clearly that this shot is absolutely, positively going to cost you both money and significant embarrassment.
